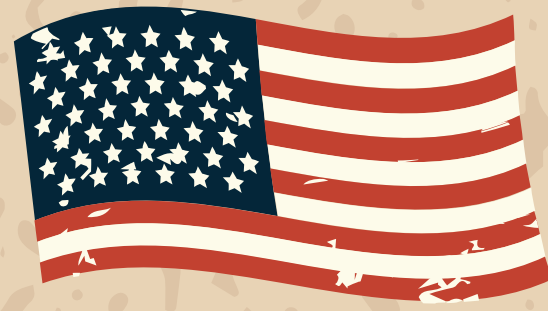

Miguel Iglesias Vegas is a Biology teacher and Head of Department of Biology and Geology at IES Montevil (Gijón, Asturias), a position he has held since 2017. He holds a degree in Biology from the University of Oviedo (2007), with a specialization in Ecology, and a C1 Certificate in English from Cambridge.

His international academic background includes studies at Notre Dame High School in Red Deer, Alberta, Canada, an experience that proved formative in developing the language skills that would later support his career in bilingual education. He has taught Biology within the bilingual programme across several secondary schools in Asturias.

Beyond the classroom, Miguel is actively involved in applied ecology through his collaboration with fishing associations in the monitoring and analysis of trout population trends, studying the impact of environmental change and recreational fishing on riverine ecosystems. This work connects directly with his broader interest in wildlife population management.

He is also a competitive sportsman, participating in traditional archery and fishing tournaments.
